Petition to Fix the Chicanes on the Bellarine Rail Trail

Any of our readers who have ridden the Bellarine Rail Trail will be aware of the problems posed by the numerous tight chicanes along the way. Bicycle Users Geelong are supporting this petition which reads as follows:

Dear Geelong Mayor and Councillors,

Please fix the unsafe chicanes on the Bellarine Rail Trail between Geelong and Drysdale - bring them up to Ausroads standards.

Why is this important?

The narrow chicanes on the Bellarine Rail Trail are the blight on an potentially great trail.

The chicanes:

- pose safety and access issues to all riders. inexperienced riders are particularly likely to collide with the heavy wooden chicanes.
- reduces use by Tandems, bikes with trailers, loaded touring bikes, cargo bikes/trikes which typically cannot be ridden through the chicanes
- don't stop dirt bikes (they can access the trail in other places and negotiate the existing chicanes)
- provides a uncomfortable experience for tourists who are less likely to return to the Bellarine Peninsula's fine wineries, beaches and landscapes.

Renovating the chicanes will improve access to the trail, get more people riding, walking, running, skating. It will be safer for cyclists, leading to more locals and tourists enjoying the Bellarine Rail Trail. It's a great asset that needs to reach its potential.

How it will be delivered?

We'll submit this petition to the Councillors at a meeting.

Minutes of Boroondara BUG Meeting, Wednesday 12th March 2014 Elgin Inn, Hawthorn

Matters Arising:

- 1. **Hawthorn to Box Hill Trail:** Peter Campbell has written to all state MPs regarding his recent collision with a car while riding in Burwood Rd. He has had 20 responses, mostly referring him to his local member Robert Clark. Julia B reported that Hedley Finger recently narrowly escaped a similar collision in Harold St. There were various suggestions as to additional people who should be pressured to act on a safer bike route.
- 2. Golfers Choice and Urban Bush Path: Nil to report.
- 3. **Darebin-Yarra Link:** David H has been invited to join the stakeholder group set up by VicRoads. The next meeting was to be on 17/3 to consider flooding issues. Glennys J recommended the use of fiberglass grid on board walks, as better for flooding and also quieter than timber. The latter could be an issue for the golf club. John Piesse suggested that separate paths could be provided for pedestrians and cyclists in Willsmere Park, but the general view was that this is something to look at once we have the link in place.
- 4. **Belford Rd Underpass**: Nil to report. This is an item on the BAC agenda.
- 5. **Dights Falls Trail:** The BBUG presentation to the LMA panel is now being prepared. This needs to be rehearsed. It was agreed that the working group would meet at Peter Campbell's place on Wednesday 19/3, and the rehearsal would take place on Wednesday 26/3, in one of the Boroondara Library meeting rooms. Julia B agreed to book this and request a data projector and screen. Presenters will be Peter Campbell, John P, Peter Carter and David F. An audience is needed for the rehearsal.

A briefing note is also being prepared for interested stakeholders and the original submission is being revised. Productive meetings have been held with Bicycle Network, Tom Melican from Banyule, and City of Boroondara (not sure who this means?). John Parker is seeking a meeting with Yarra Council, and Alister H is seeking one with Darebin Council and with Labor and Greens politicians. David H intends contacting the Minister for Transport.

- 6. **Stonnington Matters:** Glennys J reported that a link from the Scotchmans Creek Path to the Phoenix Park precinct, which she has been advocating for some time, has finally been constructed and is of a very good standard with a wombat crossing.
- 7. **Domestic Animals Management Plan**: Nil to report.
- 8. **Outer Circle Trail at Harp Junction:** There was general outrage at the leasing of part of this site to the Harp Hotel for car parking. This is an item on the BAC agenda. It was agreed that this issue should be raised with Tim Smith. **Alister H** offered to write letters to the *Progress Leader* and to the ward councillor (?).
- 9. **Jacka Trail/North Balwyn Leisure Trail: Julia B** reported that Lou Will is still collecting signatures for the petition.
- 10. **Invitations to Councilors to Attend BBUG Meetings:** Jill Y has been pursuing this. No councilors were available to attend this month's meeting.
- 11. **Bicycle Wayfinding Group:** Nil to report. It was agreed to remove this item from the agenda, However **Julia B** should query the working group regarding planned future activity.
- 12. Walmer St Bridge: Glennys J has not yet drafted a letter of support but will do so soon.
- 13. Mont Albert Rd between Rochester Rd and Balwyn Rd: Nil to report.
- 14. Victorian BUGs Meeting Tuesday 18th March: It was agreed that, given the clash with the MCC Bike Forum, the best course was to postpone this.
- 15. Treasurer's Report: Mal Faul was not present and had not sent a report.

New Business

- 1. **Bicycle Advisory Committee Meeting, Friday 14th March: John P and Julia B** indicated that they would be representing BBUG. Glennys J indicated that she would not be able to attend as an observer due to a Bike Ed commitment.
- 2. **Meeting with Tim Smith, Endorsed Liberal Candidate for Kew**: It was agrees that BBUG members should meet with Tim soon to brief him about various cycling issues including: the North Eastern Bicycle Corridor, the Darebin-Yarra link, Harp Junction, the need for lighting on the Kew Boulevard, the Belford Rd underpass and other issues on the Yarra Trail. **David F and Julia B** agree to liaise on a meeting with Tim.

Other Business:

- 1. **Evan Bolutis:** It was noted that Evan is retiring from his position as Manager, Traffic and Transport. It was agreed that **Julia B** would send him a note of thanks for his contribution to improving cycling infrastructure in Boroondara.
- 2. **Gardiners Creek Detour**: It was agreed that this is of an excellent standard and a huge improvement on the previous onroad detour. It was agreed that **Julia B** would write to both Coles and Melbourne Water thanking them for their respective contributions to securing this good outcome, and to the *Progress Leader*.
- 3. **Laneways:** Glennys J noted that Council has developed a Discussion Paper, <u>Camberwell Junction: bringing our laneways</u> <u>to life</u>, which investigates the various possibilities of these laneways and a questionnaire which must be completed by 11 April 2014.
- 4. **Masters Bike Pump:** Gordon M noted that the Masters Store adjacent to the Gardiners Creek Trail now has a bike pump attached to the vending machine stocked with goodies for cyclists.
